PPB Advisory Response to Productivity Commission

Supportive of:-

- Targeted reforms, not wholesale change
- Not adopting Chapter 11 regime
- Suspension of ipso facto clauses during Administration moratorium and 'safe harbour' periods
- Safe harbour for Directors and Advisors
- Pre-appointment sales of distressed businesses
- Unique Director IDs





PPB Advisory Response to Productivity Commission

Not Supportive of:-

- Administration only for potentially rather than actually insolvent companies
- Pre-appointment sales potentially being overturned in Administration
- Changing 420A obligation





U.S. Case Example

Facts

- Appointed to RE of ASX listed property trust
- Owned US REIT with 19 Government tenanted properties in the U.S.
- One property under construction
- · Commercial real estate loan portfolio
- Approx. 50 U.S. based entities
- Lock up action by debt holders
- Inability to meet interest commitments
- No D&O coverage resulting in Directors of all US entities resigning
- U.S. REIT entities ultimately file Chapter 11 proceedings
- Stalking Horse proposal rejected
- Alternate re-organisation plan ultimately adopted

U.S. Case Example

Issues/Benefits of Chapter 11

- 1. Directors of nearly 60 entities resign
 - Cessation of construction on 90% complete transit centre
 - Impact on US Chapter 11 filing
- 2. Class of creditors
 - Impaired v unimpaired
 - Cram down
 - Bond holder debt trading
- 3. DIP not independent practitioner
- 4. S.363 Stalking Horse provisions
- 5. Exclusivity period
- 6. DIP Financing
- 7. US Court process
